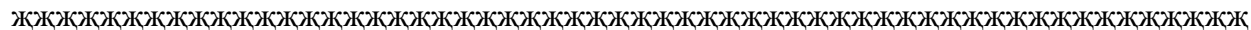

## REPORT OF PASTOR

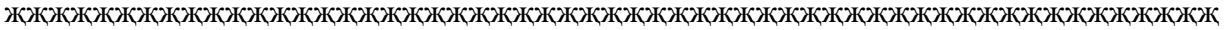

“Unprecedented” ... and ... “I don’t really know” ... Those were two of the words and phrases that I heard - and said - more times this past year than any other year I can remember. 2020 was certainly a year unlike any other. The COVID pandemic, the racial tensions, and the divisive political climate all combined to make for a very tumultuous year, one that often left us wondering how we should be responding to it. And yet it was also a year in which we saw God once again demonstrate His faithfulness in many many ways.

We began the year by focusing the Sunday morning messages on a new theme, little realizing how relevant it would become as the year wore on. Our theme was “PRAY” and our theme verse for the year was Psalm 145:18 *The LORD is near to all who call upon Him, to all who call upon Him in truth.* What a blessing it was to know that the One True God of the universe was near to us as we called upon Him throughout this difficult year. Through the rest of the winter Sundays, we finished our study of the Gospel of Mark. During the summer months we studied the life of Elijah, seeing how God works through ordinary people who pray and trust in Him. In the fall we began a study of the book of Titus, did a mini-series on voting, and finished the year with a Christmas series entitled, “Mixed Emotions This Christmas.” Interspersed throughout the year were messages specifically geared toward reminding ourselves of God’s control and His promises to be with us and give us the grace we need in every situation.

When all the uncertainty of the pandemic first hit in early March, we made the decision to cancel our services on March 15. By God’s grace, that was the only Sunday morning service we had to cancel all year. Later that week, as we weighed our options, we realized that our Outdoor Church venue gave us a unique opportunity to continue to hold church services in a way that allowed people to social distance and yet worship “together.” So beginning on a very chilly March 22 and continuing through the end of September, we held all of our Sunday morning services outdoors. Thanks to Jared MacKay’s expertise, we were also able to begin a livestream on Facebook. In many ways, these two ministry efforts (our outdoor venue and our livestream) actually increased our outreach through the year.

Our attendance and our giving remained strong throughout this time. As we re-entered the building for our services in October, we did so with a much smaller group, which was completely understandable given the COVID concerns. We were thankful that the livestream enabled us to continue to reach out to many and we continued to pray for ways to reach out to everyone.

Because of the COVID situations, we had our evening services in January -March and then again in October-December. In the early part of the year we continued to use the Picture Smart Bible drawings to help us get a handle on whole books of the Bible in one look. In the later part of the year we began a study on prayer utilizing the book, *A Praying Life*, by Paul E. Miller.

Throughout the year, I provided overall leadership to the Awana ministry as we were able to have it (see the Awana report) and to the youth ministry. I continue to pray that God will raise up leaders who are capable and passionate about directing these ministry efforts.

As in previous years, I was blessed to work alongside of our Deacons as we sought to care for the spiritual needs of our body. I thank God for Jim, Brian, Dan, and Charles. Their collective wisdom helped us walk through a wide variety of challenges that faced us as we navigated our church ministries in response to the pandemic. One of the most effective steps we took was giving every family in our church a copy of the devotional book, *New Morning Mercies*, by Paul David Tripp. The short pointed presentations of Gospel truth were extremely valuable for all of our church as we sought God's guidance each day.

I have a lot of mixed emotions as I review and wrap up 2020. It has been quite a year. But I have been so grateful to see and experience God's new mercies each and every day. I look forward to what He has in store for us in 2021 as we keep our eyes on him.

## REPORT OF DEACONS

The church theme for the year was “Pray.” At the beginning of each Deacon meeting, we spent time in prayer for one another, our Church body and asking that God would work in our Church in a special way. The book we focused on was *Fresh Wind, Fresh Fire*, by author Jim Cymbala. We have been blessed by discussing the ways that a dying church found hope through prayer and how powerful of a work God can do whenever people get serious about prayer.

We continue to be blessed by having Pastor Jeff lead the congregation and having his family be part of our church family. As 2020 began we found ourselves in the midst of a global pandemic known as COVID-19. It brought many challenges to our church and church body in the forms of quarantining, social distancing, masking and serious illnesses. We spent most of our time talking about ways we could continue the furthering of the ministry and the Gospel amidst a time when we found ourselves trying to figure out how to even conduct a church service. We are thankful that we had many means of reaching folks through social media, livestreaming of the services, and personal touches by Deacons with each of our church members. Prayer and the Gospel have been at the center of our efforts in leading Harmony Baptist through a challenging 2020 and into a 2021 centered around our Lord Jesus Christ who is in control of all things and daily manifests his authority over all of creation through his Word and as evidence in our lives around us.

Each Deacon continues to connect with people on their care list for the year and spent time ministering to those individuals through personal interaction and discussion as well as specific prayer.

We continue to work on further refining proposed changes to the Church Covenant and Constitutions, discussed our missionary support strategy and a formal process of interviewing and welcoming new members to Harmony Baptist Church. We had discussion and reviewed articles related to a Biblical view of marriage, divorce and remarriage in the church.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the special missions of the church this year.

The Retired Ministers & Missionaries offering was taken on January 26. We were able to show our appreciation for many years of faithful service at Harmony to Jim and Blanche Hockenberry, Helen Maitland, Rev. Donald Silverthorne, Evelyn Bickley, Norm and Cathy Melser and Larry and Deanna Mattox.

This year due to the COVID-19 virus, restrictions and safety precautions, we held a one night VBS. The theme was “Grow In Faith”. The children and adults that came were guided on a walk through how to “Grow In Faith”.

In October we sent over 66 Christmas Joy boxes to children in an unchurched part of Mexico through the ministry of the Master’s Mission along with leftover money for shipping. We thank you for the wonderful response.

The Awana kids collected food staples for Vision Appalachia (Clay County, WV). Thank you to each child, parent and HBC member for bringing in food to help “the least of these”.

We were able to supply the City Rescue Mission with a half of a ton of potatoes for their Thanksgiving baskets plus \$355 additional for purchasing food and/or turkeys. Some of our church families adopted men staying at the Mission and bought Christmas presents for them.

This year our church partnered with Prison Fellowship’s Angel Tree ministry. We received the names of 12 families in our area who had children impacted by a parent or guardian who is incarcerated. Our church members purchased gifts, stockings and stocking stuffers and bibles for 26 children and 12 adult caregivers. Our ladies participated in this ministry as well as they brought donations of stockings and stocking stuffers to our annual Ladies Christmas Dinner. Thank you to all who purchased, organized, wrapped and delivered gifts to the families.
